



The Institute's 32,000 sq ft footprint on the 5th and 6th floors serves as a professional state of the art recording and teaching facility featuring:

- 4 full scale recording studios, 1 equipped with Dolby ATMOS technology, 2 equipped with 5.1 Surround Sound
- 2 production suites, 2 digital audio workstation instructional labs, and 5 edit suites
- 4 private practice rooms with acoustic pianos
- An immersive critical listening room capable with ATMOS and all surround formats
