





The Institute's new 32,000 sq ft footprint on the 5th and 6th floors serves as a professional state-of-the-art recording and teaching facility featuring:

- 4 full scale recording studios equipped with Dolby ATMOS technology, 2 equipped with 5.1 Surround Sound
- 2 production suites, 2 digital audio workstation instructional labs, and 5 edit suites
- 2 large performance practice rooms, 4 private practice rooms with acoustic pianos
- An immersive critical listening room capable with ATMOS and all surround formats
- 1 large entrepreneurship conference room, 2 small entrepreneurship suites
